3 (a) The objects to be pursued by the company on its incorporation are:

1. To establish, operate, support, and maintain educational institutions including schools, colleges, vocational training centers, special education units, adult literacy programs, research institutions, and digital learning platforms aimed at providing quality, inclusive, and equitable education to all sections of society, particularly to the underprivileged, rural, and marginalized communities.
2. To undertake, promote, and support initiatives in the field of health care, including but not limited to the establishment and operation of hospitals, dispensaries, clinics, mobile medical units, telemedicine centers, diagnostic labs, and health camps for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of diseases, with a special focus on rural and underserved areas.
3. To promote cleanliness, sanitation, and hygiene in public spaces, communities, educational institutions, and workplaces; and to create awareness among individuals, households, and local bodies about proper waste management, recycling, and sustainable environmental

practices.

4. To promote the welfare and empowerment of women by providing education, vocational training, health care and legal awareness.

5. To establish, operate, manage, and maintain old age homes, orphanages, and other residential care institutions for the welfare, rehabilitation, and support of senior citizens, orphans, abandoned children, and other destitute persons, with a view to ensuring their protection, dignity, and overall well-being, particularly in rural and underserved areas.

6. To ensure the overall well-being of children from marginalized or disadvantaged backgrounds by providing access to medical care, nutrition, shelter, counseling, and basic amenities; to prevent child abuse, neglect, child labour, and trafficking through advocacy, awareness, and legal support; and to promote inclusive education and holistic development through both formal and non-formal early childhood and educational programs.

7. To promote employment generation and sustainable livelihood opportunities among youth, women, persons with disabilities, and economically weaker sections of society by providing skill development and vocational training.

8. To work towards the eradication of poverty and upliftment of economically weaker sections of society through inclusive, community-based development programs.

9. To promote public awareness and education on the prevention, control, and management of pest-related issues affecting public health, agriculture, food safety, and the environment; to provide guidance and support to communities, institutions, and local bodies on effective and eco-friendly pest management

practices; and to conduct research, surveys, and monitoring of pest infestations and vector-borne diseases such as malaria, dengue, and chikungunya.

10. To promote the welfare, rescue, and rehabilitation of stray, abandoned, injured, and ill-treated animals by establishing and operating shelters, rescue homes, clinics, and other care facilities; to undertake humane population control measures including sterilization, vaccination, and anti-rabies programs; and to spread public awareness about animal welfare laws and responsible pet ownership.

11. To promote mental well-being and emotional health by providing professional counseling, psychological support, therapy, and rehabilitation services to individuals, families, children, and communities dealing with stress, anxiety, depression, trauma, addiction, and other life challenges.

12. To prevent and reduce drug abuse, substance addiction, and related health and social issues through awareness campaigns, education, and community outreach.

(b) *Matters which are necessary for furtherance of the objects specified in clause 3(a) are

1. To collaborate with governmental, non-governmental, and international organizations for the implementation of schemes, programs, and initiatives related to women empowerment, rural development, animal welfare, agriculture, environmental conservation, and spiritual education.

2. To conduct seminars, workshops, training programs, awareness campaigns, in furtherance of the main objects, particularly in rural, marginalized, and underserved communities.

3. To establish, operate, and manage centers, institutions,

schools, clinics, shelters, farms, and ashrams for the purpose of providing education, vocational training, animal care, agricultural research, spiritual learning, and holistic wellness.

4. To provide consultancy, research, documentation, and advisory services in relation to the promotion of sustainable development, animal husbandry, women entrepreneurship, organic farming, environmental management, and spiritual upliftment.
5. To publish, print, develop, translate, distribute, or otherwise disseminate educational, scientific, environmental, and spiritual literature, newsletters, reports and journals.
6. To campaign for awareness on the aforesaid issues by disseminating information among the general public.
7. To take such other measures and render services or assistance including establishment of information centres, provision for shelter homes, setting up of educational, research and training institutions, etc., to the various persons, as may be necessary from time to time for the betterment of society.
8. To safeguard child rights and ensure the well-being of children in need, especially those exposed to abuse, deprived of education, or suffering from physical or mental health issues.
9. To work for the welfare of all minor communities.
10. To seek assistance and cooperation from the public and the government, as may be necessary for achieving the objectives of the organization.
11. To enter into agreements, franchise agreement and contracts with Indian or Foreign individuals, firms or companies.
12. To apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire any trademarks, copy rights,

patents, licenses, concessions and the like, concerning any exclusive or non-exclusive or limited rights of any kind which may appear to be necessary or convenient for the business of the Company and to purchase or otherwise acquire any information as to any invention which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the Company.

13. To acquire and take over the whole or any part of the Business, Goodwill, Property of any person or persons, Firm, Corporation or Undertaking, either existing or new engaged in any Business which the Company is authorized to carry on.

14. To amalgamate, enter into partnership, co-operation, joint venture or reciprocal concession, with any individual person or Company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on with similar or identical objects.

15. To sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof as the Company may deem fit.

16. To recruit, train, and develop technical, managerial, and professional personnel, and to engage or retain experts and consultants to enhance the Company's operations through innovation and modern management practices.

17. To insure the Company against all types of risks and liabilities, and to manage legal proceedings or disputes through litigation, settlement, or arbitration as necessary for protecting the Company's interests.

Provided that the company shall not support with its funds, or endeavor to impose on, or procure to be observed by its members or others, any regulation or restriction which, as an object of the company, would make it a trade union.

5 (i) The profits, if any, or other income and property of the company, when-so-ever derived, shall be applied, solely for the promotion of its objects as set forth in this memorandum.

(ii) No portion of the profits, other income or property aforesaid shall be paid or transferred, directly or indirectly, by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit, to persons who, at any time are, or have been, members of the company or to any one or more of them or to any persons claiming through any one or more of them.

(iii) No remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth shall be given by the company to any of its members, whether officers or members of the company or not, except payment of out-of-pocket expenses, reasonable and proper interest on money lent, or reasonable and proper rent on premises let to the company.

(iv) Nothing in this clause shall prevent the payment by the company in good faith of prudent remuneration to any of its officers or servants (not being members) or to any other person (not being member), in return for any services actually rendered to the company.

(v) Nothing in these clauses (iii) and (iv) shall prevent the payment by the company in good faith of prudence remuneration to any of its members in return for any services (not being services of a kind which are required to be rendered by a member), actually rendered to the company

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9 True accounts shall be kept of all sums of money received and expended by the company and the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the property, credits and liabilities of the company; and, subject to any reasonable restrictions as to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may be imposed in accordance with the regulations of the company for the time being in force, the accounts shall be open to the inspection of the members. Once at least in every year, the accounts of the company shall be examined, and the correctness of the balance-sheet and the income and expenditure account ascertained by one or more properly qualified auditor or auditors

10 If upon a winding up or dissolution of the company, there remains, after the satisfaction of all the debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be distributed amongst the members of the company but shall be given or transferred to such other company having objects similar to the objects of this company, subject to such conditions as the Tribunal may impose, or may be sold and proceeds thereof credited to the Rehabilitation and Insolvency Fund formed under Section 269 of the Act.

11 The Company can be amalgamated only with another company registered under section 8 of the Act and having similar objects.
